

### FINAL GOODBYES TO MARILYN M. FACHA

t is not easy for any of us to say, but we will miss Marilyn. She was truly a treasure to our Lodge and memories of her will always be with us. She made us laugh and often brought us together on trips, especially the annual trip to San Francisco Union Square for shopping at Macy's and afternoon cocktails at SF Lodge #3. She made the time on the bus fun with mimosas, coffee, pastries, games, jokes and movies.



Marilyn was practically an institution around our Lodge and she probably touched every member in one way or another. If you've ever attended a social function, she was probably there – often raising money for the good of the Lodge.

Marilyn's first introduction to Elkdom was as a secretary in the old lodge's office. She was active and dedicated to the organization long before women could join. If you talked to her, I'm sure she told you about the move from downtown. She would often say "...the Elks planned to be open for New Year's Eve, and by golly they were!" And she would just smile and laugh.

Marilyn always wanted to become a member and in 2009, as a cancer survivor (and convinced that she could do anything) she decided it was time and attended her initiation after undergoing six hours of chemotherapy that very day.

Marilyn's devotion to the Elks became a passion for fundraising. Early on, she earned the nickname "Candy Lady" because she sold See's candy to generate revenue for the Lodge. Later, she raised money by selling "blinky" costume jewelry. Her career as "The Blinky Lady" began when she bought some on a whim and then had the idea to resell it and donate the profits to the Lodge. Her efforts earned her membership to the "Millennium Club" in 2011 for having donated over \$10,000. It's estimated that by now she had raised nearly \$25,000. In fact, the hallways of Clarence and Marilyn's home are filled with the various awards and honors they have received over their years of dedication to the Elks.

Outside the Elks, Marilyn's life was filled with activities she loved and, as a Domestic Diva, she cooked, baked, tended to her flower garden and loved to sew. She truly had an eye for fashion. Marilyn is survived by her husband, Clarence, and daughters, Traci (in North Carolina) and Kelly (local) who is the mother to Erica, Marilyn's granddaughter.

Marilyn, we will all miss you at Elks Lodge #6. RIP and we will always smile when we think of you. Until we see you again. ~ PER Darnell Lawrence, Bulletin Editor


