EXALTED RULER'S MESSAGE

e are halfway through our Elk year, and I need to share some important information about our charitable giving. We are woefully behind!

While the Purple Pig is the CHEA sponsored charity, the Elks National Foundation (ENF) is our national charity. The Grand Exalted Ruler's goal is \$5 per member. Currently we are at 74¢. Money donated to ENF is returned to us to be used locally in the form of grants. For every dollar donated to ENF, \$1.75 is returned to be used in programs of our choice, but only if we meet the per member goal.

What might we lose out on if we miss the goal? The ENF offers Spotlight, Beacon, Impact, Gratitude, and Freedom grants each year. Elks 6 has had past success in submitting successful proposals and has begun the application process with Beacon and Spotlight proposals. The grants can be combined or split and depend on volunteers. In 2024, led by Dana Schilling, the lodge received a \$2,000 Spotlight grant used for Welcome Home Baskets for Veterans, and a \$4,000 Beacon grant benefiting WEAVE.

Our Grant committee will continue to pursue past lodge projects as well as new projects. The deadline for proposals to the ENF is January 22, 2025.

I need to make it clear that to be eligible for these grants, our per-member giving to ENF must meet the requirement. We, as a lodge, are a long way from meeting this goal but your Secretary, Gina D'Arcangelo, has issued a challenge to the Officers and Committee chairs:

"I challenge my fellow officers and committee members to sign up for the ENF Fidelity Club and give a recurring monthly donation, like I have, to support the ENF Elks programs which include Drug Awareness, Hoop Shoot, Veterans, Scholarships and several others. Signing up is fast, easy and secure. Go to *Elks.org/enf* to get started. Together, we can make a difference." ~ *Fraternally, Gina D'Arcangelo, Secretary*

Several of your officers have accepted the challenge, including myself, but we can't do it alone. Hopefully, all members can see fit to make either a one-time or monthly donation to help achieve our goal. Any amount helps no matter how small.

GOLF SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM


