've received some questions lately about how Lodge #6 communicates with our 700 members, so I would like to address communication. Communication

is vital between family members, friends and members of social organizations. Elks 6 communicates with our members in the following ways:

ELKS MONTHLY NEWSLETTER, "SIX" — The last week of the month you should receive the newsletter for the coming month. We mail a copy, and we post a color version to our website. If you receive a printed copy and wish to save the Lodge money by reading the digital copy, contact the office to be removed from the mail list. If we get the mail list down to a small enough number, we can increase the number of pages and the amount of information, and still save money. If you're not receiving a printed copy but want one, notify the office. To submit something for the newsletter, send it to *newsletter@elks6.com* by the 5th of the month.

WEEKLY ELKS EBLAST — Every Friday around 7 a.m. you should receive an email that contains upcoming events, ongoing events and a calendar for the month. Any special announcements are listed first, and you will find details by scrolling down the page. If you are not receiving the email, provide the office with your email address. To submit something for the eblast, email the details to *blast@elks6.com* by Wednesday.

My ELKS APP — This app is provided by Grand Lodge and is free to members. The Communication committee will be holding small training sessions at various times. Watch the eblast for dates.

ELKS 6 WEBSITE — Visit *www.elks6.com* for our local Lodge information, or *www.elks.org* for the Grand Lodge information.

POSTINGS — Event fliers and information from Grand Lodge are posted on several bulletin boards around the Lodge. Any event flier must be approved and initialed by the ER before posting. MAIL — We may mail information, however, due to cost, it's generally limited to what is required by Grand Lodge, such as the membership dues billing.

MEETINGS — I know that most of you hate meetings; I am not fond of them myself, but they are necessary. I urge you to pick a committee and drop in and voice your opinion. Meetings are open to all members, and are listed in the Newsletter and the eblast.

TEXT AND EMAIL — Various committees or the office may reach out to members by text or email. We try not to do this often.

PHONE CALL — The membership committee's goal is to be more personally in touch with each member. Over the next couple of months expect to be contacted by phone to ensure we have your current information. We'd also like to get your ideas on what is happening or not happening at the Lodge. If you have a few hours and want to help make some calls, let the office know. You can also contact me at 215/327-7712. Feel free to leave voice mail or send a text.

Please take advantage of whatever form of communication works best for you and stay in touch. The officers and committee chairs really want to hear from you.
